Saturday, July 1st is the Prescott Frontier Days Rodeo Parade. Staging at 0700 and roll at 0900. Per the staging plan, we will be staging and parading with Gudgeon and Tucson Bases at staging area #3 on Willis Street between Marina Street and Alarcon Street (Parade staging map attached). ALL parade entrants need to be in place by 8:00a.m. The parade starts at 9:00a.m.!! 

2023 RULES & REGULATIONS

Prescott Frontier Days[®], Inc. 2023 Rodeo Parade

1. All Entries are subject to the approval of the Rodeo Parade Committee.

Entries that do not conform to these rules and regulations will be eliminated. All decisions of the Rodeo Parade Committee are final. Entry fees submitted by an entry that is not approved will be refunded.

- 2. Entry fees are non-refundable. Inclement weather could delay the parade start time. Cancellation is unlikely.
- 3. Due to the number of entries and the timeframe the parade is allowed, there cannot be delays or stops to perform.
- 4. Entries are limited to no more than 60 feet in length and up to 6 vehicles.
- 5. Do not throw items (candy, gifts, etc.) from your parade entry. Entry participants may hand items to the crowd. Prescott Frontier Days, Inc. is not responsible for anyone injured by violating this rule.
- 6. Keep advertising and identification of floats and themes to a minimum and in good taste.
 - All float entries must have fire extinguishers.

► Participants standing on a float/vehicle must have something stable to hold on to for balance.

- ► All children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
- ► All children must remain seated on all types of floats/vehicles.
- ► The maximum height of ALL floats and vehicles is 13 feet, 6 inches.
- ► Do not allow your participants to reach toward power lines. The lines are **LIVE**.
- ► Be aware of inflatables and the LIVE power lines.

► Become familiar with the parade route if it affects your parade entry. If you will be discharging a weapon, be aware of your surroundings, people, and animals —

Absolutely NO LIVE ROUNDS!

- 7. Entry judging will occur during the Parade. The judges' stage is at the end of Union St., across from the courthouse. Winners will be announced in the Sunday newspaper, emails will also be sent to the parade entrants after the parade.
- 8. Consumption of alcoholic beverages or drugs prior to or during the parade will not be tolerated.
- 9. Participants may arrive at their **assigned staging area** at 7:00 am to receive participant numbers and finish parade preparation. Staging area volunteers will arrive at 7:00 am with your staging numbers, in your staging areas. All parade participants must be in place by 8:00 am.


- 10. Horse entries, please review these guidelines:
 - Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult walking or riding alongside.
 - All children under the age of 12 riding on a horse MUST wear a protective helmet. No exceptions.
 - Vehicles pulled by a horse(s) (including but not limited to a wagon, stagecoach, or trailer) must have an adult walking alongside or riding with the horse(s) to help control the horse(s) throughout the parade route. A safety rope/out-rigging must be attached to the team lead to stop the team.
 - Only one (1) rider per horse.
 - All equine entrants should be familiar with Arizona Revised Statutes ARS 12-553 concerning limited liability of equine owners and owners of equine facilities.
- 11. Parade award certificates will be awarded the week **following** the rodeo parade but no sooner than July 10, 2023.


