Darby's was the local bar that submariners hung out which was just off Rosecrans street not far from the base.

So, we all piled into a vehicle and headed off to Darby's. We arrived and entered through a side door to a ruckus. The barkeep was already regaining order with her night stick and eventually threw the miscreants out the door. It was a quick lesson in bar etiquette.

Darby's catered to sub sailors. The walls were covered with boat plaques and other paraphernalia. The two pools tables were always busy and the jut box humming. Card games and acey-deucey available upon request. No bar grub but the Mexican restaurant next door satisfied that need. No shortage of sea stories here. The bar manager insisted that she would not tolerate any tension between the crews which for the most part was respected. Ergo, it was a relatively safe and relaxing place to go.


The Sculpin was transferred to Puget Sound Naval Shipyard for overhaul in the summer of 1974 and I never visited Darby's again. As far as I can tell, this was during Darby's heyday. In the late 70's or early 80's it moved to a location in the Oceanside community in San Diego. The bar closed it doors sometime in the late 80's; nevertheless, the camaraderie I enjoyed at Darby's with shipmates will not be forgotten.

Most of us, I expect, had a homeport bar they favored. The drinking may of been an excuse but certainly not the reason. These establishments were a place were submariners gathered for mutual benefit and enjoyment. Many relationships were cemented at these establishments that would last a lifetime.

We continue to practice this tradition at every meeting at Dillion's BBQ. Not so much beer, more ice tea, soda, food or just plain water; nevertheless, we gather for the mutual benefit and enjoyment. Also, the sea stories still know no constraints.

Northern Fleet's newest Yasen-M class submarine will be based 60 km from NATO Norway

The Arkhangelsk will now sail north to Zapadnaya Litsa, Russia's westernmost submarine base on the Kola Peninsula.

"Today is a significant day for the entire Navy," Commander-in-Chief Admiral Aleksandr Moiseev said at the <u>official ceremony</u> that took place on Friday.

The Arkhangelsk is the forth of the Yasen-M class built in Severodvinsk. Two are already sailing for the Pacific Fleet, while the third, the Kazan, belongs to the Northern Fleet. Including the prototype vessel of the Yasen class, the Severodvinsk, the new Arkhangelsk will be the third of the class deployed with the Northern Fleet.

Yasen and Yasen-M class are 4th generation multipurpose nuclear-powered submarines in the Russia navy.

The Arkhangelsk (K-562) was rolled out of the ship hall at Sevmash in <u>late November</u> last year and has spent the last <u>13 months on sea trials</u>, including navigation and weapons testings in the White Sea and Barents Sea.

Tsirkon missile

Admiral Moiseev praised the onboard weapons systems and said they are "capable of hitting both sea and coast targets."

The Yasen-M class can carry Kalibr and Oniks cruise missiles, but more important for the navy is arming these new submarines with the Tsirkon hypersonic cruise missiles, a weapon key for Russia in the ongoing naval arms race with NATO. It is not clear if the *Arkhangelsk has tested the Tsirkon missile yet*.

A Tsirkon was <u>first time tested</u> from the Yasen-class submarine *Severodvinsk in October* 2021, from a submerged position at a depth of 40 meters in the Barents Sea.

The scramjet maneuvering wing anti-ship cruise missile is said to be capable of accelerating up to Mach 9 (nine times the speed of sound) and has a range of up to 1,000 kilometers. That means a launch from inside Russia's bastion defense area in the Barents Sea can reach enemy warships practically anywhere in the part of the Norwegian Sea north of the Arctic Circle.

Although Russia is bragging loudly about the Tsirkon missile's invulnerability to modern air-defenses, reports came earlier this year that <u>Ukraine had shot-down</u> two of the missiles. Those missiles were allegedly launched from land-based launchers.

Soviet Era Torpedoes

An important role for the Russian Northern Fleet's multi-purpose submarines is hunting for enemy submarines that can threaten the ballistic missile submarines sailing with the country's second-strike nuclear weapons capability. In a longer article on Thursday in state-controlleed <u>Izvestia</u> newspaper, questions are asked about the torpedo armament. Yasen-M submarines are currently armed with torpedoes from Soviet times and the new torpedoes have not yet been fully tested.

"... there is work to do, something to improve," Izvestia writes.

It was a Soviet era torpedo that in August 2000 exploded inside the *Kursk* submarine, triggering a larger explosion in the torpedo compartment blowing off the front of the vessel so it sank, killing all 118 onboard.

Six Yasen-M to Zapadnaya Litsa

Construction of the Arkhangelsk started on March 19, 2015 and took nearly 10 years.

Russia is planning to expand its fleet of the Yasen-M class to 12 vessels. Half of them could be based in the Northern Fleet. After *Arkhangelsk follow the Perm, Ulyanovsk, Voronezh and Vladivostok, all currently under construction at the Sevmash yard in Severodvinsk.*

The Northern Fleet has chosen the piers in Nerpitcha at the submarine base in Zapadnaya Litsa as home port for the Yasen and Yasen-M class vessels. Located a short 60 kilometers from the border to NATO country Norway, Nerpitcha is the westernmost of all naval bases in northern Russia.

Third named Arkhangelsk

Nerpitcha was originally built for the Cold War giant Typhoon submarines sailing the Arctic waters in the 1980s and 1990s.

One of the Typhoons, the TK-17 was also named *Arkhangelsk*. The first Oscar-class submarine, the K-525, was also named *Arkhangelsk* when she was in operation from 1980 to 2005.

RAY MARSHALL TRIBUTE BANNER

Perch Base Submarine Veterans (USSVI) Life Member and Webmaster Dan Marks honored WW2 Submarine Veteran Ray Marshall, who went on Eternal Patrol on on September 10, 2021, at the age of 101 years old. Gilbert, AZ, honored Veterans by displaying Military Tribute banners in the Heritage District along Gilbert Road from May 21st to July 8th to coincide with the display periods of Memorial Day and Independence Day. The banners were taken down on July 8th, but put back up from November 5th to November 19th to coincide with the display period of Veterans Day. Ray Marshall's banner was located on the east side of Gilbert Road at the Gilbert Chamber of Commerce parking lot at 119 N. Gilbert Rd. ENC(SS) Raymond Marshall, a WW2 veteran, made 12 war patrols on two different boats. Ray joined the Navy in January 1939 and retired as a Chief Engineman in 1959. His first assignment was on the destroyer USS Mahan (DD-364) from 1939 to 1940, but then was assigned to the Submarine Service in 1940. He qualified in submarines in 1941 on the USS Porpoise (SS-172). Ray made 12 war patrols during WW2 on two different boats. He served for six war patrols on the Porpoise, leaving as a Motor Machinist Mate First Class, then six more war patrols on the USS Guavina (SS-362) where he became a Chief Motor Machinist Mate. After the banner was taken down on December 5, Dan gave it to Raymond's daughter, Marion, as a memory keepsake. Marion said, "It meant so much to her and her husband Ron to have him remembered for the amazing man who he was. Ron and Marion did get to see the banner hanging on Gilbert Rd where he could oversee the world he so enjoyed passing by."

Perch Base Receives Traveling Dolphins




