Mistakes are Part of Life

A college basketball coach was reflecting on his team's 115-57 loss during a postgame conference and said "I think the whole game hinged on a single game call.

A sportswriter asked, "Which one was that?"

The coach said, "The one I made last year scheduling the game."

The value of learning from mistakes cannot be overstated. In my experience, mistakes are indeed valuable learning opportunities. Dealing with the consequences of a mistake can improve your ability to navigate and find creative solutions.

Mistakes are the natural byproduct of trying new things, pushing boundaries, and innovating. It is important to remember that if you are not making mistakes, you might not be taking enough risks. And without risks, progress can be stifled. By making mistakes, you learn to evaluate risks more effectively, which can lead to better decision-making in the future. Plus, understanding where you went wrong helps you avoid similar pitfalls moving forward.

As author F. Scott Fitzgerald said," Never confuse a single mistake with a final mistake."

Mistakes are a form of feedback. They tell you what doesn't work and provide a unique opportunity to tweak your approach. Mistakes often teach us more than success does. They highlight our weaknesses, allowing us to address them directly.

Taking responsibility for your responsibility for your mistakes is crucial because when you own up to your mistakes, you demonstrate integrity and gain respect from others. It build character and shows you are willing to take accountability for your actions. Try to fix the mistake, not the blame.

The USS Barb (SSN-596) and a B-52 Stratofortress.

Daring at Sea Rescue



On 8 July 1972, USS Barb (SSN-596), lay in Apra Harbor completing repairs prior to a patrol in the Mariana Islands. Typhoon Rita was approaching Guam, and USS Barb intended to be at sea and submerged before the storm arrived.

Shortly after 04:00 hours, "Cobalt 2", a B-52 Stratofortress of the Strategic Air Command commanded by United States Air Force Captain Leroy Johnson, took off from Andersen Air Force Base, intending to fly over the storm. Soon after takeoff, however, the aircraft became uncontrollable, and the crew bailed out. By 05:25, the six-man crew were in the ocean. A C-97 Strato-freighter spotted the survivors and radioed their location to Joint Search and Rescue at Agana.

USS Barb (SSN-596) and submarine USS Gurnard (SSN-662) were ordered to proceed at best speed to provide rescue.

At about 23:00, USS Barb surfaced about 12 miles (19 km) from the reported location. The heavy weather had already forced surface ships to turn back, and caused the round-hulled submarine to roll and corkscrew violently. It was 01:15 hours the next morning before the boat's crew spotted the survivors' lights. They made numerous attempts to rescue the airmen through the night, but did not succeed.

By 07:40 hours, visibility had improved and the typhoon had moved from the immediate area, and the boat approached a group of three rafts. Several attempts to shoot a line to the survivors failed, so Chief Torpedoman Jon Hentz volunteered to swim to them, towing a line. At about 08:15, the rafts holding Major Ronald Dvorak, the Electronic Warfare Officer, Lieutenant William Neely III, the copilot, and Lieutenant Kent Dodson, the navigator, were secured to the submarine. Over the next hour, they were brought aboard, a task made more challenging by the 40-foot (12 m) waves that often exposed the submarine's screw and the ballast tank flood grates at the bottom of the boat.

At about 10:00 hours, orbiting aircraft vectored USS Barb to the next survivor, Airman Daniel Johansen, the aircraft's gunner, who caught a line shot to him and was pulled aboard in less than a quarter-hour.

Meanwhile, USS Gurnard arrived on the scene, found Captain Leroy Johnson, the aircraft commander, and brought him aboard. Lieutenant Colonel J.L. Vaughn, the radar navigator, had not survived the night. Aircraft sighted his body floating face down, still tied to his raft.

Newest nuclear-weapons carrier arrives in home base Gadzhievo

The Northern Fleet welcomed the Knyaz Pozharsky with festivity to her new home base on August 2. Shortly after, Ukraine's Defense Intelligence Directorate (HUR) published classified internal documentation concerning the brand new submarine.

The Knyaz Pozharsky is the third of the new 4th generation ballistic missile submarines to sail for Russia's Northern Fleet. The Borei-A class sub can carry 16 Bulava missiles armed with nuclear warheads.

The submarine was <u>handed over to the Navy from the Sevmash shipyard</u> in Severodvinsk on July 24 in a ceremony attended by Vladimir Putin.

From the yard by the White Sea, the voyage went directly to Gadzhievo, the base north of Murmansk on the Kola Peninsula which is home to the 31st Submarine Division with all the Northern Fleet's ballistic missile carriers.

The Knyaz Pozharsky was <u>rolled out of the ship hall</u> at the Sevmash yard in early 2024 and was supposed to be handed over to the Navy by the end of last year. However the sea trials took longer than expected.

The Knyaz Pozharsky (K-555) is to the knowledge of the Barents Observer the first post-Soviet delivered ballistic missile submarine that has not conducted a successful launch of the main weapon - the Bulava missile - before being handed over to the Navy.

This test is normally part of the state acceptance trials for any new warships and submarines.

A bigger blow to the Russian Navy is the secret documents about the submarine that Ukraine's Defense Intelligence Directorate (HUR) made public on Sunday, August 3.

"The information obtained by the intelligence allows us to identify the features of the technical specifics not only of the *Knyaz Pozharsky, but of other submarines of Project 955A [Borei-A], critically important for supporting the imperial myth of the aggressor state Russia."*


Published via <u>Telegram</u>, HUR attached 10 pages from what appears to be a longer report about the *Knyaz Pozharsky*, *including*:

- Name lists of the crew, including data on positions, qualifications and level of physical training;
- Combat instructions for the crew;
- Combat scheme of the submarine, schemes of systems for ensuring survivability and organizational structure of the crew.
- Crew instructions in cabins and cockpits, instructions for transferring the wounded and cargo, procedures for towing and other job descriptions.
- Engineering documentation, including a report on the study of a deformed radio beacon indicating the members of the commission and the enterprises that participated in the study.

The documents revealed by the Ukrainian special services do not only reveal secrets about the *Knyaz Pozharsky*, but information relevant for all Borei-A class submarines of which there are seven in operation; two with the Northern Fleet and five sailing for the Pacific Fleet. One more vessel, the Borei-class Yury Dolgoryky is currently docked in Severodvinsk for mid-life upgrades, including changing of uranium fuel elements in the reactor.

Although there are no serious military secrets in the part of the documents made public, there are likely many more pages obtained by Ukraine's Defense Intelligence Directorate that are not made available for outsiders. With the move, Ukraine sends a clear message to Russia's Armed Forces: We have inside sources leaking top military secrets.




Perch Base Annual Awards Banquet

A - Northeast Bird's Eye View

The USS Phoenix, SSN-702, Cold War Monument project has reached the 90% design milestone. This means that the architectural, civil, structural, geotechnical, landscaping, electrical and mechanical engineering design has been completed. The next steps will include fiscal evaluation to determine if the design concepts compatible with the project budget. The project management team estimates that the present design is within the project's budget. Also, the Phoenix Parks Department must approve the design plans and fund the project. If all goes as expected, the next couple of months will involve obtaining the necessary construction permits. The project management team estimates construction will start in January of 2026.

In Honor of Veterans Day and in Reflection of Fallen Service Members

If you would like to visit a sobering and reflective tribute posted on an official US Government web site, then I invite you to browse online to, (www.abmc.gov/).

The American Battle Monuments Commission (ABMC) maintains 26 permanent American military cemeteries, 31 federal memorials, monuments, and markers, in 17 foreign countries, honoring over 200, 000 fallen U.S. Armed Forces service members. One of these locations is the Manila American Cemetery and Memorial in the Philippines. It contains the largest number of graves of our military dead of World War II, a total of 16,859, most of whom lost their lives in operations in New Guinea and the Philippines. The headstones are aligned in 11 plots forming a generally circular pattern, set among masses of a wide variety of tropical trees and shrubbery.

There is a chapel, a white masonry building enriched with sculpture and mosaic, standing near the center of the cemetery. In front of it on a wide terrace there are two large hemicycles. Twenty-five mosaic maps recall the achievements of the American armed forces in the Pacific, China, India, and Burma. On rectangular Trani limestone piers within the hemicycles, are inscribed the Tablets of the Missing containing 36,286 names. Rosettes mark the names of those since recovered and identified. Currently, there are just over 500 rosettes found on the Tablets of the Missing at Manila American Cemetery and Memorial. Carved in the floors are the seals of the American states and its territories. From the memorial and other points within the cemetery there are impressive views over the lowlands to Laguna de Bay and towards the distant mountains.


