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Howard,

As discussed on the phone today, I discovered the left taillight/license plate holder was damaged when I went to the storage yard to replace the Ty-Wraps on the flagpole holders with metal clamps (which I completed) on the "people trailer."

I am confident that this happened since we returned the trailer to the storage yard after the Prescott Parade on Saturday, June 30, 2018. If it happened earlier, I'm sure that you, Carl, or myself would have noticed at that time.

I went to the office and identified the damage. They had me fill out an Incident Report. They will look at their video records and said they would notify me if they saw anything happening. They also will take pictures of the damage, which I have also done.

The storage yard said that I could also notify the police if we intended to submit for insurance. I don't know if the damage has caused the taillight to be non-functional. I have already looked online at the taillight replacement cost, which is estimated to be \$34.36 plus shipping. I looked at the same company where I obtained the marker lens for the taillight on the other side of the trailer. Based on the limited cost, insurance (even if it is covered, which I doubt) would not pay anything due to typical deductibles. As a result, I don't believe a police report is warranted, but if anyone feels strongly to the contrary, I can file a report.

I will add a file to the [Float Maintenance](#) page of our website with this email, the Incident Report, the photos, and the replacement taillight quote from the internet. It is more convenient than trying to load your email with large file attachments.
