There have been updates, but no major changes to the website during the past month. I added the Eternal Patrol and February inurnment notice for Dave (Flapper) Fledderjohn, presentation information for the veteran burial benefits that was distributed at the January meeting, veteran hospice care information from our Chaplain, the Event Photos for the USS Ray (SSR-271) plank presentation to Bob Wright, the Tale of Two Cities photos, updating Sailing Orders, uploading Flash Traffics and meeting minutes, Lost Boat notices, and Half Staff notices. Similar updates have been maintained on the Perch Base Facebook Group.

During January, there were approximately 1,490 page views on the Perch Base website during 637 sessions by 421 users based on Google Analytics. That is a decrease in page views, but might be partly a result of my testing following the hosting change last month. Approximately 83% of the sessions originated in the US, and 2% each from the United Kingdom and France. The remaining 13% were widely scattered around the world. Approximately 58% of the sessions were from locations within Arizona. The Homepage accounted for the largest (37%) percentage of the page views this month, exceeding the Glossary (20%,) Photo Selection page (10%,) the Sailing Orders page (10%,) and the Eternal Patrol page (4%.)
